From the President & CEO



Summer planning

SUMMER is finally here. Schools are closed for summer break, the grass is growing, and our area has turned into a green oasis. With the arrival of summer, it is important to check a few items to make sure your house is operating as efficiently as possible.

First, if you have an air conditioner or heat pump, take the time to either replace or clean its air filter. June is usually when air conditioners start running extra hours, so by keeping the air filters clean, you can save up to 35% off your electric use with clean filters.

Next, check your lightbulbs. An LED lightbulb will use about 10 times less electricity than a conventional incandescent bulb, so remind yourself to change a few out each week until you have them all replaced. Using LED bulbs will pay for themselves in under a year.

While we are on checklists, please make sure you have a demand response unit (DRU) installed on your water heater. Currently, we have about 25% of our members taking advantage of these units. I would love to see even more taking advantage of this. The DRU doesn't cost you a penny. We will even give you a \$100 bill credit for allowing us to install one on your water heater. When power consumption is at its highest and the costs are the most expensive, these little units will shut down your water heater elements for a short time until the use and cost drop. Your water heater is well insulated, and you will still have hot water during this peak time, yet you won't be using any electricity.

By doing this, our members are conserving energy at the peak times, which keeps costs down for the entire cooperative. It is the perfect cooperative example showing what we cannot do individually, we can accomplish together. The capacity cost of power, which equates to about 50% of our cost, is set during the five highest consumption hours in June, July, August and September. This month will help establish almost 50% of next year's power costs, so please consider allowing us to install one of these DRUs at your home. If you are interested, please contact any of our offices, and we will get you in touch with the correct person.

The last checklist item is our "electric shift" ads on TV and radio. These are to let you know it is a high peak day and we are asking you to shift your electric use to a later time. This gives you a great opportunity to fire up that grill out back. You can also adjust your thermostat up and close blinds or shades to keep the sun from heating up your home, use ceiling fans to circulate the air, and put off doing any laundry until later in the evening. Every little bit helps, so when you hear these announcements, please try to do your part to keep your electric costs down for this year and many years to come.

State agriculture secretary talks dairy trends, farm tourism during chamber luncheon

Pennsylvania Secretary of Agriculture Russell Redding discussed the findings of a recent study on agriculture during an April visit to Huntingdon County. He also reported that an increasing number of farmers are diversifying their income through sidelines like ag tourism.

Speaking at a Huntingdon County Chamber of Commerce luncheon Wednesday, April 10, Redding said he was encouraged to see a variety of stakeholders take the time to learn more about the importance of agriculture. The Huntingdon County Career and Technology Center in Brady Township hosted the event, and the audience included local business leaders, as well as students from two local Future Farmers of America (FFA) chapters.

"As challenging as agriculture is, I still admire the entrepreneurial spirit that's in it, and the perseverance of families that are committed to it," Redding said.

Redding said local school districts are fortunate to still have ag programs. He said just 150 of Pennsylvania's 500 school districts offer such programs. He said there is a need for a better-defined educational path for young people hoping to have careers in agriculture. There are 28 in-demand jobs in agriculture, but just eight of those have defined career paths, Redding said.

In January 2018, the department released a study of the economic impact of agriculture and the food industry in the state. The study — the first comprehensive effort to define the industry and quantify its impact — showed that agriculture has a \$137.5 billion impact on Pennsylvania's economy. That represents 18 percent of the gross state product. The industry supports nearly 580,000 jobs paying nearly \$27 billion in wages, the department reported.

The department worked with the Team Pennsylvania Foundation and Temple University's Fox School of Business to conduct the impact study. It sought to answer the questions "What is ag in Pennsylvania?" and "Who is ag in Pennsylvania?" The study broke ag into farming, forestry, the equine industry, food processing and the green industry (horticulture).

Redding said the operating margin for Pennsylvania dairy



farmers is razor thin with milk prices of \$14.50 per hundredweight. He said, however, that consumption of dairy products is up and that unemployment in the agriculture sector is below the national average.

"Fluid milk is just not being consumed," Redding said. "Total dairy (ice cream and other dairy-based products) continues to increase. I think that's the silver lining. But consumption continues to decline on fluid milk. There's a lot of pain in this industry at the moment."

Redding said lifestyle changes have affected fluid milk sales. As an example, he noted that cereal bars are popular but their convenience has cut milk consumption at breakfast. He advocated making milk more mobile by packaging it in six-packs of individual serving-sized bottles, so consumers can purchase and store it in the same way they do a variety of other beverages.

Hoover, a Valley REC member who operates a family farm in Warriors Mark Township with his wife, Deb, has also served on the Huntingdon County Farm Bureau Board of Directors.

"It's a well-known fact that agriculture is a big pat of the Pennsylvania and U.S. economies," Hoover said. "It's also a well-known fact that agriculture is facing difficult times. There was a time in the nation's history when 98 percent of the people were involved in agriculture. Today, 98 percent of the world is not involved in agriculture."

Valley Rural Electric sponsored the luncheon along with local businesses CBT Bank, Price Motor Sales and Nationwide Insurance – Pamela Stern & Associates, LLC. The career and tech center's culinary students prepared and served the all-Pennsylvania lunch.

The Blue Juniata FFA Chapter from Juniata Valley High School conducted opening and closing ceremonies. FFA students from Southern Huntingdon County High School also attended.

"The science of turning sun, soil, and water into food, fuel, and fiber to feed the seven billion residents of our planet takes the largest workforce of any industry," Hoover said. "These FFA members are living in an exciting time to be a part of that workforce necessary to keep the science of agriculture growing."

"The face of agriculture has completely changed during my lifetime," Hoover added. "I am certain that agriculture will continue to change. I cannot imagine what changes these young people will see in their lifetimes."

Questions from the audience ranged from property tax


reform and milk marketing board pricing policies to ways the ag department can assist farmers in developing off-shoot, supplemental businesses — such as wedding and specialty event venues, dairy tours, craft breweries, and alpaca farming — to sustain their bottom line.

Redding outlined the provisions of the Pennsylvania Farm Bill, the first-ever package of such legislation that would invest more than \$24 million to address the needs of farmers. He discussed succession planning and noted the realty transfer tax exemption in the proposed Pennsylvania Farm Bill would provide an exemption for any transfer of preserved farmland to a qualified beginning farmer. He reported that 5,400 farms in Pennsylvania are "preserved" farms that will be in agriculture for perpetuity. Pennsylvania boasts 63,000 farm families who steward more than 7.7 million acres of farmland.

"I think it's one of the great moments of our time, that people are actually rediscovering agriculture; when people stop and think, agriculture wins. But they have to stop and think first," Redding said. "When you have chambers thinking about it, school districts thinking about it, FFA chapters, car dealerships, insurance agencies, then you start to see things happen."

He added, "Thank you for thinking about agriculture and its importance here and for extending the conversation to What do we need to do to keep it here and transition to a new generation that is going to be desperately needed?"

Governor Tom Wolf nominated Redding to serve as the 26th Secretary of Agriculture for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in January 2015. He was confirmed by the Senate on May 14, 2015. On May 1, the Senate unanimously confirmed Redding for a second term. Redding is the former dean of the School of Agriculture and Environmental Sciences at Delaware Valley University, formerly Delaware Valley College.

Aerial patrol, pole inspection slated for summer months

Aerial patrol

Valley Rural Electric's annual aerial inspection of our distribution system will begin later this month. Getting a birdseye view of lines and equipment allows co-op staff to better plan improvement projects and right-of-way trimming.

Todd Ross, Valley REC vice president of operations, says the helicopter fly-over enables operations personnel to quickly and efficiently find areas where maintenance is needed, especially in areas that are difficult to reach from the ground.

"The aerial patrol will cover our whole system," Ross says. "It's faster than driving and also more efficient because you get a better view of pole tops and equipment from the air than you would from the ground looking up into the sun."

The vantage point from the helicopter also makes it easier to spot dead trees that could pose a hazard.

Valley REC is again contracting with Pine Bottom Aviation Services, LLC of Martinsburg. The fly-over is low enough to allow the co-op employee accompanying the pilot to see cracked insulators and crossarms and other equipment that needs to be repaired or replaced. Members should not be impacted by the aerial inspection work.

Pole inspection

The co-op has contracted with Osmose Utilities Service, Inc. to conduct pole inspection work. Osmose crews will begin inspection and treatment work in July and it will continue into late summer.

"It's a continuation of what we have been doing," Ross says. "We're on a 10-year cycle."

Pole inspection work is scheduled for the following locations: Shade Gap District – Dublin Township, Fulton County; Metal Township, Franklin County; Cromwell, Dublin, Shirley, and Tell townships, Huntingdon County; and Lack Township, Juniata County.

Martinsburg District – Freedom, Huston, Juniata and North Woodbury townships, Blair County.

Huntingdon District – Juniata, Lincoln, Penn and Walker townships, Huntingdon County.

Extending the useful lives of utility poles through inspection and treatment is cost-effective for the co-op, since the price of a pole can range from \$130 to more than \$260. Identifying deteriorating poles can save the co-op money and spare consumers the inconvenience of an outage.
