Farm museum supporters planning final touches on new building

By Doug Roles Vice President of Member Services FAIR and carnival season is winding down, but the folks at the Huntingdon County Farm Museum, on the Huntingdon County fairgrounds, are thinking ahead to spring. They're hoping to have the final touches put on their new building, Geisinger Hall, in time for the museum's seasonal reopening.

The museum committee is in the process of raising \$40,000 to finish pouring the final two-thirds of the concrete floor in the building, which measures 60-by-160 feet. The new hall was open to visitors at the fair, held the second week of August. Fisher Brothers Builders of Juniata County constructed the metal-sided post-andbeam structure.

"People were really happy with the new building," says Gary Eberle, a museum committee member. "We heard a lot of good comments during the fair."

Running short on space for its more than 5,500 display items, the committee in 2019 launched a capital campaign which, to date, has raised more than \$120,000. In the summer of 2020, the Geisinger Health System donated \$75,000 toward construction of the new building, and work began. Ronald McDonald House then donated \$10,000, enough to pour the first section of the floor.

"We hope to have the rest of the floor done by next spring," Eberle says.

The origins of the farm museum have a history of their own. Shirley Township dairy farmers Barbara and the late James McMath founded the museum in 1987 at the urging of Harold Lockhoff, a Penn State Extension agent and

The museum's exhibition was first housed in a Huntingdon and Broad Top Railroad (H&BTRR) building, donated to the fair in 1955 when the H&BTRR long siding to the Pennsylvania Railroad at Huntingdon closed. In 1991, the fair board built a 60-by-120-foot metal building to house the farm museum, with an addition constructed in 2003. The railroad building now houses the fair's Art Station. Geisinger Hall will house tractor and heavy equipment displays once the floor is finished.

The museum committee members and volunteers bring their own passion for history and varied agriculture backgrounds to the effort to preserve central Pennsylvania's farming heritage. Eberle, a member of the Gettysburg-based Adams Electric Cooperative, grew up on Eberle Brothers' Farm near Shaver's Creek in West Township, Huntingdon County. During his career, he worked for Agway and Pennfield Feeds.

One of the newest volunteers is Penn Township resident Colby Grubb, a 2020 Huntingdon Area High School graduate and history enthusiast. Grubb participated in Valley REC's 2019 Youth Tour trip to Washington, D.C. He's a walk-on to the museum family.

"I just showed up here one day, and they had to take me, whether they wanted me or not," Grubb jokes.

He is a student at Penn Highlands College, Huntingdon, and plans to earn a bachelor's degree in social studies at Shippensburg University. He would like to teach history in Huntingdon or Mifflin counties.

The museum committee is comprised of 10 members with an additional 10 to 15 volunteers giving time to the various tasks inherent in maintaining displays. Though the museum closes a few weeks after the August fair, tour groups are welcome by appointment.

"We're back in here in the spring as soon as the weather gets warm enough," says Barry Anderson, the committee president. "We're here every Thursday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m."

A trip through the farm museum wouldn't be complete without checking out the old "REA" (short for the federal Rural Electrification Administration) utility pole provided by Valley REC. Anderson, a Mapleton area resident and Valley REC member since 1966, has a special appreciation for the days when co-ops were referred to as "the REA." He noted that his family "has been on Valley Rural since it came into existence" in the late 1930s.

Southern Huntingdon County residents may remember Anderson as the





proprietor of Anderson's Service Center, a gas station that used to operate in Knightsville, near Saltillo.

Eberle, Anderson and Grubb were among the volunteers who worked this year to construct an 8-by-22-foot wooden workshop in a rear corner of the Geisinger building. Garner Lumber of James Creek donated the lumber for the tool shed that houses a variety of items needed for maintaining displays.

Visitors to the museum will see a wide array of vintage farm equipment and other items from daily life in days
